As a first generation Latino student, a solid public education helped me escape a poverty stricken community. Today, my 3rd grade twin daughters are doing very well in a SCUSD school. However, I'm dismayed to see that so many kids are lagging behind—especially Latino and African American students. I want to bring my passion for education and experience in education policy to benefit all of our students. Further, like so many Americans after the 2016 Presidential elections, I've been motivated to serve in a greater capacity.

## Section 2 - District & Governance

2.1 Are you familiar with the budget(s) for which you will be responsible, if elected? If so, state how large it is, what its principal revenue sources are, and what its largest expenditure categories are. The Sacramento City USD budget revenues total \$531million. The primary revenue sources are federal, state, and local funds with the largest expenditure being employee salaries/benefits.

2.2 Will you support moving to by-district elections (rather than at-large) where they are not held now? Please explain. Yes, it's important for voters to be more connected with their representative and for that representative to live in the community he/she represents.

2.3 What sets you apart from other candidates for this office? I will bring a balanced perspective to this office. I am a parent with two kids in elementary school, and I am a professional with experience in developing K-12 education policy. If elected, I would also be the only Latina on the school board.

2.4 How will you work with community advocates? What will you do to be accessible to community members and other stakeholders? In my professional world, I work with advocates everyday and work in a collaborative manner towards a common goal/solution. I am accessible, open, and straight forward and I expect to work with local community members in the same manner.

2.5 What will you do to promote transparency and ethics? Lead by example, and ensure that big proposals and decisions are afforded maximum transparency and public discussion.

2.6 What whistle-blower protections should there be for public employees who expose corruption, sexual harassment, or other illegal/unethical activity? Maximum protections should be available for any employee who blows the whistle on such behavior, especially when it involves taxpayer dollars.

2.7 Do you believe that current campaign finance rules should be changed? If so, how would you change them? Yes, I believe that all contributions should be disclosed regardless of donor and contribution amount, especially relating to super Political Action Committees.

## Section 3 - Civil Rights

3.1 What will you do to advance the rights of:

I will be a strong, effective voice on the board to advance the rights of all students, especially historically disenfranchised students. In advancing or modifying any policy or curriculum, it's critical to get the input from the impacted student groups to inform changes.

3.2 What will you do to end discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and gender identity in education, employment, and housing? I would push for policies to end discrimination in any realm.

3.3 What is your position on a woman's right to comprehensive healthcare, including the right to choose and access contraception, and the right to obtain a medically safe, legal abortion? I support a woman's right to choose.

3.4 If elected, what will you do to close the gender pay gap? I would seek an analysis of the gender gap pay in Sacramento City USD, and develop a plan to close the pay gap not only along gender, but also along ethnic backgrounds.

3.5 What is your position on immigration? Do you support an amnesty program for those immigrants already living in the United States? Do you support a clean DREAM Act, without any enforcement funding attached to it? Should undocumented immigrants have a path towards citizenship? Why? I support comprehensive immigration reform with a path for citizenship for undocumented immigrants, and a clean DREAM Act. As the daughter of immigrant parents, I know first hand the contributions and sacrifices immigrants have made to the success of this state and country.

3.6 What will you do to protect immigrant communities? I would push for/support policies that expressly state our strong commitment to immigrant families and children. I would coordinate with community partners such as government consulates and facilitate community meetings to inform, educate families about accurate information and resources, including their legal rights.

3.7 Should there be limits on free speech or assembly in public places, such as protesting or picketing? Please explain. No, I support I support the right to free speech and to assemble in public spaces in a peaceful manner, even when I disagree.

3.8 Do you support background checks for all gun and ammunition sales? What other restrictions on firearms do you think are appropriate? Yes, I support background checks for all gun and ammunition sales. I also believe that assault rifles should be banned.

3.9 Do you feel the criminal justice system is just and fair to everyone? If not, what reforms would you like to see? No, the criminal justice system is not just and fair to everyone, especially to disenfranchised communities. I would like to see more investment on rehabilitation programs, and the opportunity for individuals to have easier access to education while incarcerated.

3.10 Do you support capital punishment? If so, please explain when you think it's appropriate. No.

3.11 Please share your views on the Black Lives Matter movement. I support movements to sunshine the challenges of disenfranchised communities, I believe these movements are often the catalyst to have difficult conversations that lead to necessary change.

3.12 How will you work toward greater police accountability? What role would the community play in that? It's important to have regular audits of police department and behavior. It's critical that the policy department have community meetings to discuss audit findings, and to communicate and work with the community on solutions. Police needs to be present in our neighborhoods at all times to develop positive relationships with members of our communities. I think it's important to recognize that sometimes an independent review/ investigations are often necessary such in the cases of officer-involved shooting that result in a fatality.

3.13 Do you support the universal use of police body cameras? When is it appropriate to release police body camera footage? Yes, footage should be released as soon as possible.

3.14 What will you do to make your community more accessible to people with disabilities? I would ensure that Sacramento City USD has policies and practices that are inclusive of people with disabilities. I think it would also be important to hire teachers, district and certificated staff that are people with disabilities to have an inclusive working and teaching environment for all students.

3.15 What will you do to ensure that non-English speakers can fully participate in public

meetings and access public services? Make sure that translators are available at meetings, as well all, ensuring that documents are available in the necessary foreign languages well in advance. I also believe that as a native Spanish speaker, I would be able to fully engage and communicate with the Spanish speaking community in Sacramento.

#### Section 4 - Healthcare

4.1 Do you believe that healthcare is a human right? If so, what do you believe is the most effective way to provide quality healthcare for all? Yes, I believe a single payer system is the most effective way to ensure affordable coverage for all.

4.2 What is your position on parental notification prior to a minor terminating a pregnancy? Please explain. I support a minor's right to privacy.

4.3 What measures would you support to ensure adequate mental health services for all? It's important to work across agencies to ensure that students, and their families, have the necessary mental health services in and out of school.

4.4 What will you do to help address high child mortality rates in the black community in Sacramento County? Schools are often the centers for communities, and there is an opportunity to work with relevant agencies, health care, social services, etc., to school fairs to provide information and education to African American families to address this tragic situation.

#### Section 5 - Good Jobs for All

5.1 Describe your relationship with organized labor. My father was a cement mason for 23 years, and an active union member Laborers Local 652, Orange County. I support organized labor.

5.2 Do you support the right of workers to unionize by card check? Yes

5.3 Have you attended the Sacramento Central Labor Council Candidate Academy? Not yet

5.4 Do you support project labor agreements? Yes

5.5 Which labor unions will you be interacting with in your role? What is your plan for building collaborative relationships with union and nonunion employees? Sacramento City Teachers Association, classified employee unions, and trade unions. I am plan to meet with union and non union members to develop and maintain positive working relationships to ensure student success.

5.6 What is the role of the office that you seek in promoting good jobs for our region? Sacramento City USD is responsible for preparing all students for college and career opportunities as well as hiring teachers and classified staff to ensure that students are successful.

5.7 What solutions would you propose to solve budget shortfalls and how would you prioritize the needs of your constituents? It's important to have open and ongoing communication with all stakeholders, including teachers, staff, parents, etc., to best prepare during an economic downturn. Solutions should focus on solving budget shortfalls with the least amount of impact on classroom instruction.

5.8 Do you believe income inequality is an issue in your community? If so, what steps would you take to address it? Yes, income inequality exists in Sacramento, and 70 percent of Sacramento City USD students are low income. It's important for school staff to identify income eligible students and make sure that the services are provided, Free and Reduced Priced Meals, Medi-Cal, or any other subsidy program.

## Section 6 - Local Economy & Public Resources

6.1 Under what circumstances would you support raising revenues by means of taxes or fees to support public services and why? I would support proposing raising revenues to voters to fund/restore basic services and programs in cities, counties, and schools.

6.2 How do you balance more progressive vs more regressive forms of taxation or other revenues and their specific impacts on the community, and what means of such revenues would you have at your disposal and support? I support progressive tax policies, but I also support measures such as parcel and sales taxes as they help our kids.

6.3 Under what conditions would you support the privatization of public or natural resources (i.e. water, publicly-owned buildings, schools, park lands, parking facilities)? None, I would explore public/private partnerships if the school district could no longer provide a service and when the partnership provides a benefit to the public/community.

I support in concept the SE Connector to better link the communities and job centers of Elk Grove and Rancho Cordova. However, I'm willing to learn more about the pros and cons of this proposal.

7.2 When is it appropriate to expand the urban growth boundary? Only when infill growth is not feasible.

7.3 Please describe your position on regional habitat and working lands conservation. I support habitat and lands conservations plans and efforts.

7.4 What will you do to address climate change in your role? Please be specific. It's important for our students to learn about the impact of climate change in their classrooms, and for the school district to find ways to recycle, compost, etc.

7.5 Please describe your education and/or experience with land use planning. I have limited experience with land use planning, but it's important for school board members to know about city and county land use planning projections for years to come to better plan to build new or modernize school facilities.

7.6 Have you read the General Plan and do you agree with its vision of future development? If not, what changes would you propose? No, I have not read the General Plan therefore unable to provide insightful feedback.

## Section 8 - Education

8.1 Do you support Restorative Justice and funding such programs? Yes, I support these programs and support funding for school districts to establish and grow these programs.

8.2 What role do you believe charter schools should play in public education? For profit

charter schools have no business in public education. In my professional capacity, I have worked with many successful dependent charter schools that focus on providing dual language immersion opportunities, and drop-out recovery programs to students. However, my focus will be on improving our traditional public schools.

**8.3 Do you support reforming teacher tenure, due process protections, or teacher salary and benefits? Please explain. I support teacher tenure, due process protections, and teacher salary and benefits. Overall, we pay our teachers too little in our State and Country.**

**8.4 What will you do to minimize bullying and promote tolerance in school? How will you help promote a safer environment in schools for all students? Annually review district policies to decide whether or not they need to be updated, strengthened to ensure safe schools. As a sister and cousin to LGBTQ, I saw how school safety and tolerance is paramount to the success of all students. I want to make sure that school climate surveys include questions directly targeting feedback from LGBTQ students, parents/guardians.**
