Section 3 – Civil Rights

- 3.1 What will you do to advance the rights of:

From my work at WEAVE, I believe in an inclusive, welcoming and equitable environment for all minorities, sub-cultures and races. I will promote policies that expand the rights of these groups and also review disciplinary action to set the tone for the district in reacting to wrong-doing towards these communities.

3.2 What will you do to end discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and gender identity in education, employment, and housing?

I will hold the District accountable to our laws and policies in ensuring that proper disciplinary measures are taken with regard to discriminatory acts.

3.3 What is your position on a woman's right to comprehensive healthcare, including the right to choose and access contraception, and the right to obtain a medically safe, legal abortion?

I believe in a woman's right to choose.

3.4 If elected, what will you do to close the gender pay gap?

I will promote transparency and policies that ensure that the gender pay gap is lessened or at least identified as an issue with steps to reduce this disparity.

- 3.5 What is your position on immigration? Do you support an amnesty program for those immigrants already living in the United States? Do you support a clean DREAM Act, without any enforcement funding attached to it? Should undocumented immigrants have a path towards citizenship? Why? I support DACA, and an amnesty program for those immigrants that haven't committed felonies. Yes, undocumented immigrants should have a pathway to citizenship because they contribute to our economy and also are a part of our communities.
- 3.6 What will you do to protect immigrant communities?

I will support policies that advocate for nondisclosure and also integration of services and resources.

3.7 Should there be limits on free speech or assembly in public places, such as protesting or picketing? Please explain.

The Constitution and key legal cases have already established these limits with regard to time, place, manner, restrictions, hate speech, etc., and I support these forms of assembly and legal restrictions in Supreme Court cases.

3.8 Do you support background checks for all gun and ammunition sales? What other restrictions on firearms do you think are appropriate?

Yes. I addition to banning bump stocks, we need to ban assault rifles and automatic weapons and ammunition that is designed to discharge fast. Background checks for private party sales, internet sales and also increased training requirements for CCW permits.

- No. I would like to see supportive services for language barriers, competent pro bono and appellate panels.

BLM is an important civil rights movement and their key statements/priorities are rooted in discrimination and appalling conditions, policies, that have resulted in unjust/unfair death in their communities.

The community needs to know about policies and enforcement priorities. Transparency and accountability need to be incorporated at every level of the law enforcement institutions.

- 3.13 Do you support the universal use of police body cameras? When is it appropriate to release police body camera footage?
- Yes. There needs to be standard policies that automatically release footage around serious injuries or deaths, and regular access by community groups.
- 3.14 What will you do to make your community more accessible to people with disabilities? Support policies that allow for transparency, access to records, trainings and related mechanisms.
- 3.15 What will you do to ensure that non-English speakers can fully participate in public meetings and access public services?

Promote availability of interpreters, language-line access and other methods to allow for full participation.

- 4.1 Do you believe that healthcare is a human right? If so, what do you believe is the most effective way to provide quality healthcare for all?
- Yes. Universal healthcare has to be the standard.

- I think it depends on the age of the minor. If a minor is between 12-14, or, if the minor is 16-17. It also depends on who the legal custodian of the minor is.
- 4.3 What measures would you support to ensure adequate mental health services for all? Policies that educate our communities about the need for mental health services. I'll also support positions and budgetary line items with regard to program implementation and design.
- 4.4 What will you do to help address high child mortality rates in the black community in Sacramento County?

Training and education are vital. Also, ensuring that our institutions that respond to crises leading to these mortality rates have an understanding of the factors: political, cultural and socio-economic factors, as well as an understanding of implicit bias.

FCEA (a part of the California Teacher's Association) and the AFL-CIO/Sac Labor. Collective bargaining leads to power to both union and nonunion employees. With efforts underway to undermine the power of labor unions, it is important to convey the benefits that unions provide to all employees.

We have to keep administrative overhead at a minimum and transfer those savings to our teachers and students.

We're losing our rural boundaries with the constant expansion of the urban growth boundary. We have to think of global solutions to the issue of jobs, transportation, housing, etc.

is if they are mimicking public schools by trying to overtake them or receive more funding.

- I think performance should be a factor considered in teacher tenure, however, we have to be careful about current issues and perceptions in our community and parent reactions with regard to teachers. It shouldn't be a personality conflict or for the wrong motivation. Where the teacher commits a crime or engages in such behavior, we have to find ways to ensure the teacher is properly disciplined.
- 8.4 What will you do to minimize bullying and promote tolerance in school? Discuss your feelings about the bullying and harassment of LGBTQ students because of their real or perceived sexual orientation and/or gender identity. How will you help promote a safer environment in schools for all students? I will increase the priority to socio-emotional learning and find ways to integrate "play" more into students' lives.

LCFF and LCAP allow districts to set funding options and accountability based on their student population and student needs. It gives districts greater flexibility in funding and allows them to set core objectives related to increasing student performance.

We have to help increase wages so that everyone has the ability to afford housing and save money. Based on an analysis of the city's workforce, we have to designate and provide for adequate levels of

affordable housing.

To implement priorities and streamline permit processes that will accelerate the completion of allocated affordable housing units and construction.

Yes. Landlords cannot hold our housing markets and vouchers hostage.

9.7 What is your plan to ensure that working class people have opportunities for home ownership? The American economy and dream are built on the concept of home ownership. We have to provide policies and plans in place to help working class people afford homes and benefit from it.

<u>Section 10 – Transportation and Public Transit</u>

10.1 Would you support a local sales tax measure to fund transportation and public transit? Please explain.

Yes, we cannot continue the multiple cars per household equation. We have to promote mass transit, offer schedules that will work for the community and promote leaving your car behind.

10.2 If you are seated on the board of SACOG, STA, or Regional Transit, how would you use your role and what would you prioritize?

I would prioritize affordability and access.

10.3 What is your plan to reduce Vehicle Miles Traveled in the region?

Safe, affordable and accessible alternate transportation options.

10.4 What is your plan to improve local and regional public transit? Please describe a priority project.

If we have better routes and more frequent options, it will help people leave their car behind and take public transportation. In Folsom, a complaint cited often is that people don't take the bus. However, it is because the routes are not well-planned and the frequency of the transportation is too infrequent. Improvement of the experience and communication with the community is key.
